

On Tuesday this week we held our Assessment and Progress Committee Meeting where we shared our analysis of end



of year internal data and an initial overview of our SATs results which were only made available an hour or two previously. As the data is not vet validated I will resist the temptation to share at this point but I would like to mention how incredibly proud of each and every one of our Year 6 pupils I am. As individuals they could not have done any more and I am once again indebted to the whole staff team for preparing the children for these statutory tests. The committee also received an in-depth breakdown of all our pupil's anonymised data across reading, writing and maths. It is abundantly clear that our strategic priorities are having a positive impact and everyone is working extremely hard to enable our pupils to achieve their potential whilst importantly maintaining a broad and rich curriculum full of extended opportunities.

In addition to this, on Thursday evening (and what felt like into the night!) the Full Governing Body met for this term's meeting. The agenda for this is always extensive and now with two schools to monitor, it was destined to take time. But once again there was so much to celebrate in terms of progress relating to provision and attainment. We evaluated the impact of our strategies for Pupil Premium, Sports Premium and SEND Funding, Looking ahead, discussion also centred around agreeing strategic priorities. policies, governor training and terms of reference for committees as well as evaluated the Governing Body's impact.
